GPEI Members and Friends Invited to Sacred Activism Conference in Tulsa

Have you heard? An extraordinary conference is planned for Tulsa, Oklahoma on May 9—12. The “Sacred Activism and the Power of Inclusion” conference will feature nationally-known speakers such as Andrew Harvey, among the most prominent mystics in the world; Caroline Myss, medical intuitive and author, Lauren Artress, founder of the Labyrinth Movement; Michael Lerner, president, Network of Spiritual Progressives; Paul Ray, author of the *Cultural Creatives: How 50 Million People Are Changing the World*; and Robert Kennedy, Jr., senior attorney for the Natural Resources Defense Council.

It is not all that often that the heartland states organize and host such a gathering with so many strong and progressive leading voices, and especially leaders who are so attuned to the values held deeply by Great Plains Earth Institute members and friends.

This conference is part of a series of Sacred Activism conferences planned around the nation by Wisdom University, Oakland, CA. Wisdom University is the successor to the Institute of Creation Spirituality founded by Matthew Fox. On Saturday, January 27, GPEI joined with other significant groups to host a preliminary meeting about the conference at Inter-Faith Ministries. Speakers were United Methodist minister Rev. Bill Crowell (formerly associate pastor at College Hill United Methodist here in Wichita and now pastoring and part of the planning committee in Tulsa) and Carmen White-Janak, a lay leader of the New Dimensions Spiritual Center in Tulsa. Bill, a faithful GPEI member while he lived in Wichita, offered a presentation prepared by Paul Ray of Wisdom University, titled, “Creating a Wisdom Culture.”

If any presentation could whet our appetites for this conference, it was this! Here is a sample of the slide titles and information: “No longer an era of change, but a change of eras...The world is getting better and better, and worse and worse, faster and faster...There are 3 subcultures today (traditional —24.5%; moderns —49.4%; cultural creatives —26.1%)... Today is like when ancient tribes needed to move to a new territory: it takes a major vision of possibility to get people to move, make your costly move to grasp new opportunities when you have a big surplus; don't wait until you are nearly starving and you have to go to new territory in survival mode.”

Carmen White-Janak spoke for the conference planning coalition in expressing their determination that this conference be inclusive, rather than exclusive. A quick review of the conference agenda indicates speakers and worship leaders from the African-American church, the Episcopal church, the Islamic Society, an Hispanic Pentecostal pastor, a Jewish rabbi and cantor, a Sufi mystic, an Imam of the Nation of Islam, Oklahoma Baptist churches, the Unitarian Universalist church, and an elder of the Wichita tribe of native people.

At the conclusion of the January 27 meeting, the idea was raised to charter a bus from Wichita to the conference in Tulsa. See information elsewhere in this newsletter on these plans. Friends, this conference looks like a great opportunity to get those great progressive creation spirituality energies flowing strongly again!

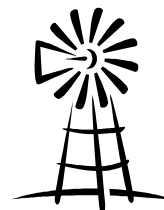

THE ENERGY FIX: 10 Steps to End America's Fossil-Fuel Addiction

Following is a summary of an article of the same title by Tom Clynes found in the July, 2006, edition of *Popular Science*.

The author claims that by the year 2025 we can cut our oil consumption in half, and slash our reliance on electricity-producing fossil fuels, like coal and natural gas, almost entirely, using a suite of new technologies assembled with the help of dozens of scientists and energy experts.

The major roadblocks to this new energy era are no longer technological; they are political and bureaucratic. If we can overcome them we can reduce trade deficits, enhance national security, and create millions of non-exportable jobs. The 10 steps follow:

* **Harness the wind.** Already in 1991 a government wind-resources inventory concluded that Kansas, North Dakota and Texas had enough wind available to meet the electricity needs of the entire country. In the meantime stronger and more lightweight turbine blades allow for stronger and bigger machines.

* **End Gridlock.** Making power where we use it does away with the cost of having it come from a central source.

* **Rev Up Our Hybrid Rides.** Building plug-in Hybrid cars will slash fuel usage and emissions. They recharge overnight and so take advantage of low off-peak electrical rates. When the plug-in technology becomes widely used it will make today's hybrids seem gas-guzzling, by comparison to the 300 mpg cars that can be in the future.

* **Brew Better Ethanol.** There will need to be a wide-scale switch from corn to cellulosic ethanol, a fuel made from switchgrass, wood chips and agricultural waste. One study even used enzymes produced in termite guts.

* **Switch On the Sun Lamp.** Turning sunlight into volts through the use of stirling solar dishes produces a much higher rate of returns than the traditional flat panels.

* **Go H₂.** Hydrogen powered fuel cells are already more than twice as efficient as internal combustion engines. Some day it may be produced with surplus wind power.

* **Ride the Waves for Watts.** In Portugal workers are already installing offshore wave-energy converters. Water power's advantages over wind include the usual predictability of tidal currents. "The wind may or may not blow, but you can predict the moon and tide 1,000 years from now." They call it lunar power.

* **Dig Deeper.** Our ability to use the heat from the Earth is expanding far faster than our use of this technology. That energy can be used to produce electricity or to heat buildings. Many experiments in the use of geothermal power are being run effectively.

* **Make Gas from Trash.** We are perfecting new ways to produce electricity from agricultural waste, grassy plants, and even sewage. Gasification systems use extreme heat in a low-oxygen environment to convert these biomasses into a mixture that can be burned in a boiler or turbine, and can increase efficiency by 10 %.

* **Use "Negawatts."** Back in the 1970's you saved energy simply by turning off the lights. Today we save it by using technology to do the same things better. There is no cheaper or cleaner power than that power which you don't produce, thus "**NEGAWATTS.**"
